

What are MyHealth@EU services?

They enable a patient's health data to be shared with a doctor in another European country via the secure European MyHealth@EU network, which connects Member States via their National Contact Point for eHealth (NCPeH).

The doctor treating a patient from another European country connects to their country's NCPeH to receive the medical document.

Which documents can be shared?

Currently, for Luxembourg, these are the following ones :



MyHealth@EU services are being gradually rolled out across Europe. They will become mandatory in all European countries as of 2029, as part of the implementation of the European Health Data Space. **

(*) The Patient Summary is a medical summary containing information on, among others, allergies, medical and surgical history, active conditions and current treatments, or recent medication.

(**) To see the list of countries where these services are operational, use the QR code on the back, under the heading 'Want to find out more?'.

What are the benefits for patients and doctors?

Access to a patient's medical history :

- contributes to better medical care
- can be crucial in the event of a medical emergency
- facilitates the continuity of safe, high-quality care across borders

Since the data are also available in the language of the treating doctor's country, this removes potential language barriers.

How can I benefit from MyHealth@EU services?



I am a doctor practising in Luxembourg

- 1) Log in to the MyHealth@EU service at www.esante.lu with your eSanté account.
- 2) Select the patient's country of origin, enter their identification details and select the document you wish to receive.



I am a patient registered in Luxembourg

- 1) In my Electronic Healthcare Record (DSP - Dossier de Soins Partagé), I register my consent for cross-border exchange.
- 2) This will allow doctors in other European countries to view my patient summary, lab results, medical imaging reports and/or hospital discharge letters.
