Why EU projects?

Missions of Agence eSanté

- The national platform shall be able to communicate with similar platforms in other Member States
- Promote interoperability and security
- Monitoring of best practices
- Collaboration with international instances

Reality

- Patient's mobility is increasing
- Luxembourg is in the heart of Europe



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JAsEHN: Description



- joint action mechanism led by the European Member States and co-financed by the European Commission - launched in May 2015
- regrouping national eHealth competencies of the Member States - EU eHealth stakeholders and standardisation organisations are integrated through a separate dedicated stakeholder liaison mechanism
- Objective : act as the main preparatory body for the eHealth Network, with the aim to develop political recommendations and other instruments for cooperation in the four priority areas of eHN's Multiannual Work Plan :
 - (1) Interoperability and standardisation
 - (2) Monitoring and assessment of implementation
 - (3) Exchange of knowledge
 - (4) Global cooperation and positioning



JAséHN: Benefits

- ensure further common political leadership and the ongoing integration of eHealth into health policy
- foster a long-term political commitment in the field of eHealth
- identify and propose future objectives that could be considered in follow-up activities
- increase awareness and knowledge of eHealth
- generate greater willingness of stakeholders to take part in eHealth



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Trillium II: Description

Reinforcing the Bridges and Scaling up EU/US Cooperation on Patient Summary

- 2 years, 25 partners, 14 countries, 2 continents
- Building on the Trillium Bridge experience and community
- Improving International Patient Summary, its governance and its adoption
- In conjunction with SDOs and relevant stakeholders
- Including clinical needs, semantic and technical interoperability, piloting

eHealth Digital Service Infrastructure

- 3 years, 16 Member States
- Facilitates continuity of care and patient safety of citizens seeking cross-border healthcare
- Through Patient Summaries and ePrescriptions
- Setting up and operating national contact point for eHealth: NCPeH
- Under the supervision of the eHealth Network (Directive 2011/24/EU)
- Funded by the Connecting Europe Facility (CEF) instrument

Defining a Conformity Assessment Scheme for Europe

- 2 years, 17 partners, 12 countries
- Aligned with international best practices such as IHE CAS, Continua certification, ...
- Incorporating actual and future needs
- Recognised in Europe and beyond
- Linked to the ReEIF

Vendors and IT companies


- Reduced effort in interoperability testing
